



10th Canadian Masters Athletics Indoor Track & Field Championships

LOCATION - Universiade Pavilion (Butterdome), University of Alberta, Edmonton, Alberta.

DATE - Friday, March 8 - Sunday, March 10, 2019

Welcome – Athletics Alberta and Canadian Masters Athletics would like to welcome all masters athletes to the 10th Canadian Masters Indoor Athletics Championships being held in conjunction with Athletics Alberta indoor provincial Championships. We welcome both Canadian and Non-Canadian athletes to the competition. Please see the competition details below.

HOSTING

ATHLETE ELIGIBILITY

- All participating athletes, if resident in Canada, must be current masters members of a Canadian Provincial Athletics Canada branch (Athletics Alberta, etc.). If resident is outside Canada, participants must be members of CMA, USATF or another WMA National Affiliate.
- All athletes must be 35 years of age or older, as of March 8, 2019.

ENTRY INFORMATION

- All entries must be made via Trackie Registration <u>www.trackiereg.com/2019CdnMastersChamps</u> <u>Non-Canadian athletes</u>, please indicate "Foreign" on the registration form when it asks for "Member ID".
- Entry fees to March 1, 2019 at Noon (MST) \$35 for the first event, plus \$15 for each additional event. Late entries until Noon on March 3rd, 2019 \$70 for the first event plus \$30 for each additional event.
- All relay teams must be registered by March 1st, 2019. Relay team entries \$40 per team. Teams must be declared 60 minutes in advance of the scheduled relay times.

AGE GROUPS

- All competitions are in 5-year age groups, beginning with ages 35 to 39, 40 to 44, etc., and progressing to the age of the oldest competitor.
- Age is calculated as of the first day of the Championship, March 8, 2019.

PACKAGE PICKUP

• Competition packages will be available for pickup at the Universiade Pavilion (Butterdome) on Friday from 4:00 PM to 8:00 PM, Saturday and Sunday from 8:00 am until 5:00 pm. Athletes are encouraged to pick up their packages as early as possible.

AWARDS

- Canadian Masters Athletics medals will be awarded to the first, second and third Canadian finishers in each gender and age group in each event. Non-Canadians finishing in the top three will also receive duplicate non-championship medals.
- The members of the first-place relay team in each gender and age group for each relay event will also receive CMA medals.
- These awards may be picked up at the Awards Table 40 minutes after the event results for each event have been posted. A podium and backdrop will be available for photographs for the award winners. Athletes who are unable to pick up their awards may have them picked up by a coach or team-mate, but unclaimed awards will not be mailed out.

RESULTS

• Start lists, heats and results will be posted as available at the Butterdome and on line. Full results will be posted on the AA and CMA web sites after the meet.

MEET RULES

• IAAF Rules, as varied by World Masters Athletics.

MEET NOTES

- Women's heats run first. Younger age groups run first
- All finals are timed finals, A/B finals may be used depending on number of entries.
- If there are 8 or less in the 50m, 60m, there is no semi in that age group the race is a final.
- If a competitor has clashing events, the straight takes precedence over the oval event, and the oval takes precedence over the field events. Officials will not hold up events.
- All throwing Implements will be provided.
- All outside implements must be weighed and entered prior to the competition.
- Once an implement is entered into competition, it must remain at the event site until the officials release it.
- There are two full lanes of 27-inch hurdles to accommodate the necessary height requirements
- Please direct any appeals to the Technical Delegate and not the officials.
- Canadians breaking CMA Indoor Records will not have to process record application forms.
- ALL Spectators are limited to the upper viewing area.

FACILITY

• The Championships will take place in the Universiade Pavilion of the University of Alberta, better known as the "Butterdome", because of its exterior shape and color. The Butterdome, built for the 1983 World University Games, is located at the corner of 115th Street and 87th Avenue on the University North Campus. The World Masters Athletics Indoor Championships will be held in Edmonton in 2021, and the Butterdome will be an important venue for those Championships.

• The facility contains a 200m, 7 lane Mondo track surface with a 10 Lane 60m straight. All spikes will be limited to a 7MM length, no Pin spikes allowed. Athletes and officials must not wear street shoes in the fieldhouse. Change & Shower rooms with lockers will be available. You must bring your own lock and remove it at the end of the meet. Locker room access is granted by providing you Masters accreditation.



ACCOMMODATION -

• AA has appointed the Delta Hotel Edmonton South Conference Center as the Host Hotel. It is located at 4404 Gateway Blvd. NW, Edmonton, approximately 7 Km from the Butterdome.
