Anti-Doping Policy

Although the focus of the Canadian Centre for Ethics in Sport (CCES) is on the athlete competing at the International and National levels, all judo events in Canada are subject to Canada's Anti-Doping Policy and are therefore subject to unannounced doping control.

Tournament Guidelines & Rules

- IJF rules apply. Judo Canada and Judo Alberta regulations as of the tournament date will be enforced. The Tournament Director reserves the right to make any changes in the best interest of the event/contestants.
- White & blue judogis are mandatory for U16 & older. Exception: Novice Senior, Veterans and Ne Waza.
- White judogi is mandatory for U10, U12, Novice U14, Novice U16, Novice U18, Novice U21, Novice Senior, Veterans & Ne Waza. Blue judogi is optional for 2nd name called.
- U14, U18, U21, Veteran & Ne Waza athletes who fight in U16 or Senior division on Sunday, will NOT have to weigh in twice for the same weight division. **Check-in for Sunday's division is REQUIRED on Saturday within 30 minutes of the last match of the day or before. Athlete, coach or another designate can confirm at Joseki. IF NOT CHECKED IN BY THIS TIME, SUNDAY'S REGISTRATION WILL BE REMOVED WITH NO REFUND.**
- U14 & older and Ne Waza can only compete in one division per day.
- U10 & U12 Competitors must check in from 3-7 PM Friday, March 10, 2023 at the Volunteer/T-shirt table.
- U10 & U12 can be mixed gender matches. U10 & U12 groups will be comprised of up to 4 judokas. Submitting incorrect/guessed weights may eliminate a judoka from participating.
- There will be Novice divisions for U14 and older for lower ranks. Novice divisions cannot register as "early bloomer".

Match Lengths & Determination

U10: 2-minute non-stop matches

U12: 2-minute matches

U14/U16/Veterans: 3-minute matches

U18/U21/Senior/Ne Waza: 4-minute matches

*Seeding - based on Judo Canada rankings.

Divisions of 2: best 2 out of 3

Divisions of 3, 4 and 5: round robin

Divisions of 6 and 7: double pool

Divisions of 8 or more: modified double knockout

Awards

U10 & U12: medals for all competitors

U14: medals for 1st, 2nd & 3rd

Ne-waza, U16 & older per Judo Canada policy:

- 1 competitor: no medal
- 2 competitors: 2 medals – providing that both won a bout
- 3 competitors: 3 medals – providing that three won at least one bout
- 4 competitors: 3 medals
- 5 competitors: 3 medals
- 6 & more competitors: 4 medals

A figure often overlooked in competitive fighting is the third person in the ring. Referees are responsible for much more than casual observers may give them credit for. They are responsible for ensuring fair competition between two fighters abiding by a set of rules. A referee's level of involvement in a match will often affect the overall flow of competition, which ultimately affects the action we view as spectators. Judo operates like any other living organism: every part, no matter how perceivably small, is necessary for its survival, and just as much as the players on the mat, referees are needed to make a competition possible. No matter how you encounter Judo, the Referring Symposium is designed to provide useful tips and information for personal development and training on the rules. **We highly recommend that all referees or coaches consider attending.**
