Competition Format:

This event will be a fantastic opportunity for all karate-ka to test their skills in a nonthreatening environment fostering growth and development. A great way for athletes to trial who sport karate is really all about.

- **Kata Rules:** Divisions of 6-8 athletes. All athletes will perform 1 kata. Top ½ will move on to a medal round, Bottom ½ will move on to a medal round. This way all athletes perform 2 kata's and compete for medals with athletes their skill level. Medals for all atheltes.
- **Kumite Rules:** Divisions of 4 athletes. Round robin format. Top 2 athletes from the round robin compete 1 vs 1 for Gold/Silver. Each athlete will compete in 3 matches minimum. Medal for all athletes.
- **Team Kumite:** All athletes can enter their name for Team Kumite! Athletes will be assigned a random team made from all athletes from all dojos. This is a great opportunity to meet new friends and even the playing field. No dojo teams.

2023 WKF Kumite Rules – spread of 8 points – absolutely no face contact and minimal body contact. Penalty points as per KBC modifications will be enforced.

Each division will cap at 16 athletes only.

Dojo instructors are highly encouraged to come coach, officiate, and be a part of the event. This is an informative skill building competition series for everyone in the karate community including not only athletes, but coaches, volunteers and parents as well.

Protective Equipment

The following protective equipment is required for all Kumite competitors:

- WKF style red & blue Gloves/Mitts
- Red & blue belts
- WKF style Shin and Instep Protectors either red/blue for athletes in advanced categories or ages 11+
- Mouth Guard
- Groin Protector (All Male competitors)
- WKF Approved Chest Protector for Females in age 14+ Advanced
- WKF approved Body Protector for all divisions 14+ Advanced

Novice & Intermediate can wear either RED or BLUE gloves and foot protectors when competing, must have RED and BLUE belt

To ensure fair play and experience of all participants will be made a priority the tournament committee will host a free referee course on Friday, June 2nd 5pm at Rodney Hobson Karate Academy. Attendees will review the latest WKF rules and the modifications being used at this event.
