- 7. Small physical footprint






Recreation Master Plan

"The emergence of pickleball has resulted in a demand for courts..."

"There is evidence of demand for indoor field sport activities and pickleball."

"Paint lines for specific court sports based on interest from organized, community-based sport groups"

"Dedicated court facilities should be considered...
There may be future interest in provision of dedicated pickleball facilities. Private lands ... or school board sites should be considered."





What Public Facilities Currently Exist?

Outdoors:

ONLY 1 COURT EXISTS in Grey Highlands at Flesherton Memorial Park

- Single court is not adequate to meet needs of players
- Shared with basketball and skateboarders
- Also, court improvements are needed:
 - Barrier to prevent debris getting onto the court from steep hill at the back
 - Surface repairs to remove divots and abrasions
 - Proper painting of court and lines



What Public Facilities Currently Exist?

Indoors:

- 4 courts at Osprey Hall and Markdale Community Hall
 - play must be altered because of physical restrictions
 - safety issues
- 3 courts on arena floor at Centre Grey Rec. Complex
 - summer use only
 - safety issue with smooth concrete




What Are Our Neighbours Doing?

Town of Blue Mountains, Township of Georgian Bluffs, and Town of Meaford all have efforts underway for the addition of pickleball facilities

Town of Blue Mountains:

- Four newly constructed dedicated outdoor courts at Tomahawk Recreation Centre
- Six indoor courts At Beaver Valley Community Centre (reduced to 2 courts during winter)





What Are Our Neighbours Doing?

Hanover:

- Converted 2 tennis courts to 6 pickleball courts
- Facility owned by Town but managed by the Hanover Tennis and Pickleball Club

- In securing access for our Club events and programs at various community indoor facilities including Markdale Arena, Flesherton Arena, and Osprey Recreation Centre, beyond what is currently offered.
