REGISTRATION

Athlete Registration

- Athletes must complete online Trackie registration: (https://registration.judocanada.org/event/2023-0ntarioOpen)
- Early registration ends on October 6th, 2023
- Late registration ends October 16th, 2023 at 2359hr EST (11:59 PM) Midnight
- No registration after this date and time will be accepted.

Coach Registration (Minimum NCCP 2 (DI) Trained)

- Online registration is mandatory for all coaches: (https://registration.judocanada.org/event/2023-
 OntarioOpencoach)
- Only 4 coaches per team/dojo allowed. Athletes who coach must also apply for coaching accreditation
- No coaching accreditation will be issued on the day of the tournament

Referee Registration (Minimum National A)

- Online Trackie registration for all referees: (https://registration.judocanada.org/event/2023-0ntarioOpenReferee)
- National B Referees are eligible to sign up for refereeing of U12 and U14 and are encouraged to volunteer for score keeping
 - All foreign and out-of-province athletes need to ensure their medical coverage is valid in Ontario.

- Approval of status due by October 16th, 2023
- Forbidden: Early Bloomer submissions for the U12 age divisions

Note:

- All prices include HST
- A \$25 penalty fee will be incurred for all mistakes made in an athlete's registration (belt or age division) that will force changes to categories after the draws are completed.
- \$10 administration fee will be applied for all cancellations between October 6th and October 14th, 2023.
- There will be NO refunds following a cancellation as after Friday October 14th, 2023. No exceptions.

Spectator Fees

\$10 for one day or \$15 for the whole weekend.

ACCREDITATION

ATHLETES, COACHES, REFEREES, AND VOLUNTEERS PLEASE NOTE: Entry into the competition area will only be permitted with valid accreditation.

Accreditation pick-up

- Date: Friday will take place at the tournament venue. ID is required for picking up accreditation badges.
- **Coaches:** may pick up their accreditation badges starting at 1600hr 2100hr (4:00 PM -9:00 PM) on October 20th. Provincial and club coaches may also pick up badges on behalf of their athletes.
- **Athletes:** may pick up their badges at 1700hr 2100hr (5:00 PM 9:00 PM) on October 20th. Accreditation pick-up on Saturday will take place at the tournament venue starting at 0800hr (8:00 AM).
- All registered athletes will be issued one accreditation badge regardless of the number of divisions entered. Athletes who wish also to coach MUST apply separately for coaching accreditation. Athletes must ensure their coach registers themselves as a coach. Accreditation badges for coaches will not be issued based on athletes' registration information.
- Note: Replacement accreditation badges can be generated at the accreditation desk at the tournament venue on Saturday or Sunday. However, there will be a \$20 CAD **CASH ONLY** charge for replacement badges.

Coach Accreditation

- ALL coaches MUST pre-apply for accreditation by October 16th, 2023 to receive a coaching accreditation badge.
- ALL Canadian coaches MUST be NCCP (Dojo Instructor) Trained or higher.
- Foreign coaches must provide proof of their coaching certification equivalent.
- Only one coach per athlete will be permitted at mat side. Maximum of four coaches per Dojo.
- Coaches must wear proper coaching attire as per the 2023-2024 Judo Canada Sanctioning Policy and Tournament Standards.











Referee Accreditation

- Referee Eligibility: Referees must be members of Judo Ontario, other Provincial/Territorial Associations, or IJF recognized Associations of other countries.
- Minimum referee level National A. Referees wishing to officiate the ne waza category are asked to contact the Chief Referee, Gerald Okimura gokimura21@hotmail.com by October 14th, 2023.
- Referees not officiating are encouraged to assist with operating the CARE.
- A referee and CARE Operator meeting and roll call will be held at the shiai-jo prior to the start of the tournament.
- All referees are asked to present themselves in the officials' room Saturday by 0700hr (7AM) and Sunday at 0730hr (7:30 AM).

Referees Meetings

Referees' meeting will take place in the officials' room at the Shiai-jo.

- Referee Meeting Saturday October 21st, 700hr 730hr (7:00 AM 7:30 AM)
- Referees' roll call: Saturday 0700hr (7:00 AM) and Sunday 0730hr (7:30 AM). Please be on time.

Volunteers and table officials must be in place at 0730hr (7:30 AM) on Saturday and at 0730hr (7:30 AM) on Sunday.











Coaches Meeting

A coaches meeting will take place at Joseki at 0745hr (7:45 AM) at the Shiai-jo on Saturday and Sunday.

Volunteers Meeting

Volunteers are asked to present themselves with their accreditation badge at the registration desk at TPASC at 0700hr (7:00 AM) on Saturday and Sunday.

RULES & SYSTEMS

Modified IJF Rules and Judo Ontario/Judo Canada Tournament Regulations will be applied.

- U12, U14: Judo Canada Tournament Standards applied.
- U16: Chokes permitted. NO armlocks.
- U18: Chokes and armlocks permitted.
- A minimum rest period equal to two (2) times the maximum match time will be allowed between matches.
- Golden Score will be applied in all divisions except U12, U14.
- White and Blue judogis are mandatory for all but U12, U14.
- U12, U14 must have white judogi with their properly fitted belt with their current rank. First name called wears white gi.
- For U12, U14 athletes can have both a white and blue judo gi or reversible judogi with their current properly fitting belt. But two blue judogi's will not be allowed to compete.
- Judo Ontario will supply white and blue sashes for the U12, U14 division.
- Uniforms (Judogis) MUST comply with Judo Canada and IJF size regulations.
- The competition area will conform to the IJF standard 8m x 8m combat surface.
- 2 Competitors will use a best of three system
- 5 or fewer competitors will use round robin system.
- 6 and 7 competitors in a category will use a 2 pool system.
- 8 competitors or more will use a modified double elimination system.
- Seeding will be based on High Performance Committee (HPC) communication with Judo Canada.
- Note: The tournament director reserves the right to revoke the accreditation of anyone showing disrespect or unethical behavior.

AWARDS

Shiai:

1st, 2nd, and two 3rd Place medals will be awarded as per Judo Canada policy.











WEIGH-INS

Athletes are allowed only one time on the official scale. Accreditation card and ID (picture ID for U18 and above) is required at weigh-in.

U12, U14, U18, U21, Veterans & Ne Waza

- U12 athletes must weigh-in wearing judogi pants and t-shirt; no exceptions
- U14 to U18 must weigh-in in underwear with 0.2 kg allowance
- U21 and senior can weigh-in in underwear and are allowed to remove underwear, no weight allowance
- 🏅 All athletes are allowed to wear an optional T-shirt at weigh-in, no additional allowance for a T-Shirt

U16, and Seniors

- Official Weigh-in: Senior 1615hr 1730hr (4:15 PM 5:30 PM)

Athletes competing on Saturday and Sunday need to weigh-in only once. See notes below.

Athletes may compete in only one division per day as outlined in accordance with Judo Canada's Tournament Policy, unless the second division is Ne Waza or Open Weight.

- Note: All participants must come to the official weigh-in with their accreditation card and with ID (a photo ID for U18 and up). Foreign Competitors must bring a current membership card of their Association, their accreditation and photo ID.
- Note: All judokas also competing in the same weight category on Sunday will NOT have to go on the scale again. They will kept in the draw unless they (or their coaches) come to logistics to be removed from competition (check-out). The check-out deadline is 60 minutes after the end of competition on Saturday.

Female: -48 kg, -52kg, -57 kg, -63kg, -70 kg, -78kg, +78kg

Note: Age and weight categories will be combined after weigh-in according the number of registrations

Note - Modified Medical Rules: All U14, U16 and U18 contestants will be allowed two one-minute free medical examinations per competitor per match (does not include treatments for bleeding) without penalty. A third examination for the same injury to the same competitor in the same match will result in their opponent being awarded the win by "Kikengachi". All incidents of bleeding in these two age categories will be dealt with in accordance with current IJF Competition Rules, Article 29 (Bleeding Injuries).
