With the persistence of many hard-working people, the city resurfaced the existing Blackwell tennis courts and turned them into 6 new pickleball courts. A Trillium Grant provided the sun shelter located on the south side of the

courts. Voila, "the hub" was formed and Sarnia Bluewater Pickleball began. We decided to

Facilities (Aldo Adamo)

Efforts are still being made to find SLPC a permanent home in Sarnia or the surrounding area. Negotiations have begun with DeGroot's Nurseries and the SLPC has been given a verbal approval that Indoor Pickleball will be offered again this year!. Our goal is to start play in the month of December and to include evening/Sunday play. More news to come.

<u>Program Policies</u> (Bill Lindsay)

There are 2 new policies which went into effect on August 1, 2024. All members are asked to read the short, but important documents that were attached to the email that was sent to everyone. Both policies address people playing in paid Programs for which they were not previously registered and thus had not paid for the Program rental.



If that person is a Club member, they will be deemed a "Substitute" for one of the regular Program spots. There will be a fee of \$6 for each time they fill in. The new Substitute Policy provides information on how this is to be accomplished.

The other new Policy is the "Guest" Policy, which outlines the process for a non-member to play with the Club during scheduled Programming. This may be helpful if someone has a relative in town for a day and wishes to have them play with us. In short, the Policy involves a waiver to be signed and a \$10 guest fee which a current member must sponsor.

Implementation of the new Guest and Substitution Policies has gone well, with several people already making use of the opportunity to sub, and we have already had a couple guests being able to fill in. Great news for those with relatives or friends that occasionally visit. Thanks to all for your cooperation in understanding and following these new policies.

Programs/Club Play/Tournaments (Bill Lindsay)

Thanks to all for making it a great Summer for our first Club Rentals out at Blackwell Park! Here's some statistics:

Different Rental Programs Offered: 34

Number of Unique Members Participating in rentals: 202 Number of 2-hour play spots filled by members: 384

The initial Summer Programming for Blackwell will end on Sep 1st. We are currently considering adding a less intense Program schedule at Blackwell for dates into September and maybe early October. If possible, we will experiment with using the on-line Salix Reservation System with auto-payment implemented. If that proves successful, we will continue with auto-payment for Winter play at DeGroot's. As you may have heard, we are anticipating some improvements at DeGroot's this year, including extended hours and more courts than we had last year.

We are also beginning plans for a Club Championship Tournament for our members at Blackwell at the end of September.

Thanks again to all who support the Club by registering for Programs. Please keep an eye out for future communications about Fall play opportunities using Salix and more news about the Fall Tournament.

<u>Safety</u> (Ron Mombourquette)

As you all know, the Club has insurance through Pickleball Canada. Along with covering liability for the club, there is a Sports Accident Policy that may apply if a member gets injured on the court. Please remember to report any injuries to the Program Coordinator, who will work with you to fill out the appropriate form. Without the incident form, we may not be covered.



The Safety Committee would like to thank our Program Coordinators for leading our play and always prioritizing the safety of each player. During our outdoor season, managing the weather and ensuring safe playing conditions is their main concern. We are reminded to take frequent breaks and stay hydrated in hot weather. If the weather has been wet, we must ensure the courts are completely dry before beginning play. By checking in with your Program Coordinator, you help

us ensure everyone's safety. Let's work together to avoid injuries, maximizing our enjoyment of the game without impacting our family life outside of Pickleball.

If you have any questions about your safety or ideas to ensure the safety of others please speak to one of the members of the safety committee.

Paddle-up System

The Paddle-up System is used when a significant number of players are waiting to play.

When you are ready to play, place your paddle in the rack, working left to right. The first four paddles from the left are the next group up to play. If you leave to go to the restroom, or if you need a rest, please do not put your paddle up until you are ready to play. For mixed play, women should place their paddles on the left and men on the right. Please keep games and rotations moving smoothly and efficiently.
