NOTE: The age division requires that both partners be of the same age division, or they will be moved up to the next highest division if they qualify.

le: if one partner is U16 and the other is U23, they would have to compete in the U23 division.

A team may move up to another division but must meet the requirements for that division.

A maximum of two (2) katas per age division as Tori and/or Uke.

A minimum of two (2) couples is required per kata to hold a kata division in a category.

In the event were there is only one (1) team in a division, they may demonstrate and be evaluated. They would receive medals.

COST (You have to pay the fees if you are tori and uke):

- \$53.00 CND per participant for one (1) kata.
- \$79.50 CND per participant for two (2) katas.
- \$106.00 CND per participant for three (3) katas.
- \$135.50 CND per participant for four (4) katas.
- There will be no reimbursement unless the tournament is cancelled.

NOTE:

Should the number of registrations require it, the Tournament Director may make changes in the order of the kata and inform the participants of the change ahead of time.

RULES:

The tournament will follow Judo Canada and the 2024 IJF rules and regulations in judging this tournament.

Judo Canada judogis rules must be followed.

Female participants must wear under their judogi a white T-Shirt with short sleeves with a round collar (no V necks) and long enough to tuck into the judogi pants.

The judogi must be white. No judogi of any other colour will be accepted.

There are no gender divisions in the tournament. All combinations are accepted.

MEDALS: For kata events medals are awarded to both tori and uke as follows:

One team	The pair must present the Kata. No competition gold medals awarded but participation medals and/or certificates may be awarded.
Two teams	1 set of gold and 1 set of silver.
Three teams or more	1 set of gold, 1 set of silver and one set of bronze.
In Nage-no-kata three (3) series, the same team cannot receive two (2) pairs of medals.	
They will receive the highest level and the following team will be placed on the next level	

SURFACES:

There are two (2) surfaces of competition of eight (8) meters by eight (8) meters with a four (4) meter security between them.

White strips of tape, 50 cm long, will be fixed at six (6) meters at the center of the competition area to indicate the starting positions for Tori and Uke. There will also be a tape indicating the center of the competition area.

INJURIES:

Minor injuries should be handled as per IJF rules (SOR rule B1.9):

Minor injury and illness:

- In case of a minor injury like bloody wound, broken nails or a problem with contact lenses, etc., and according to the decision of the judges, the kata performance will be stopped, and the athlete will be assisted by a doctor out of the competition area if needed. The competition will continue, and the pair will repeat entirely the kata after the last pair has performed.
- In case another minor injury happens to the same athlete during the second performance of the kata or after a forgotten technique or a major mistake, the pair will be given a score of 0 for the technique where the injury occurred as well as for the following techniques including the closing ceremony. A ranking will be assigned to them in the pool or in the final. If ranking them allows them to participate in the final, the next pair in the ranking from the pool will participate in the final.

Major injury or illness:

• When tori or uke is unable to continue to perform the kata because of an injury, illness or accident during the execution of the kata, the pair will be given a score of 0 for the technique where the injury occurred as well as for the following techniques including the closing ceremony. A ranking will be assigned to them in the pool or in the final. If ranking them allows them to participate in the final, and they are not physically able to compete, the next pair in the ranking from the pool will participate in the final.
