Election of Abbotsford Pickleball Association Board Members

Vote #3 - Information as of April 30, 2025

APA will be using a secure online electronic voting system to elect board members. The vote will be monitored by a Voting Committee comprised of two non-board members, Roger Melnychuk and Dan Reimer.

Each eligible APA member will be sent an invitation to vote by email when **voting opens at 11 AM on Wednesday, April 30**. If you do not see an email from APA in your email box, please check your Spam and Junk folders.

When voting, please check the box for up to seven of the nine candidates, or Abstain if you wish to vote for none. Abstaining counts towards our quorum requirements and is an important vote also. Note that youth members (5), those under 18, are not eligible to vote.

The **voting will close at 11:00 AM on Friday May 2**. When the vote closes, if there is not a quorum, (minimum of 10% of our membership 65/651 eligible voters), an in-person vote will be held during the reconvened AGM May 3.

There are eleven (11) board positions, seven (7) positions are being voted for on this ballot, there are nine (9) candidates in the running.

Note that specific board member portfolios are not being voted upon by APA members; board member responsibilities will be determined at the next APA board meeting.
