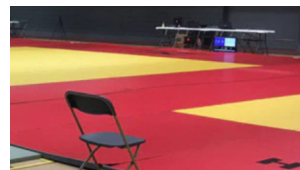

Awards

1st, 2nd and two 3rd place medals will be awarded as per Judo Canada guidelines.
Medals will be awarded as each division finishes.

Weigh-ins

Weight categories will be submitted ahead of time through online registration and will also be conducted during the registration period (8am to 11am) on the day of the competition at the tournament site. First block 8am to 9:00am, second block from 9:00am to 11am*. **Please note:** a difference of 1+ kilograms between online submission and day-of weight could result in an administrative fee of \$10.

* Times are subject to change depending on number of registrations, athletes will be notified

Note: All participants must come to sign-in with their 2025-26 Judo Canada number.

All athletes must weigh-in wearing their judogi pants and a t-shirt **with no exceptions.**
No stripping of clothing will be allowed.

Allowances are as follows:

U10-U12 where the maximum weight difference between the lightest and heaviest competitor is more than 15% of the lightest competitor, the division will be split into appropriate weight groupings.

U14-U21 600 grams

Senior & Veterans 800 grams

Rules and Eligibility

- All paid up members of Judo Ontario
- Judo Canada membership
- White judo gi's are mandatory for all ages. We will have blue and white belts accessible to athletes for expediency and sport accessibility. Competitors can also bring their blue judogi insofar as it conforms with the regulations of fitting and labeling under IJF standards and does not delay the shiai.
- IJF Current Rules Modified by NSO & PSO Regulations apply.
- True double elimination.
- Round robin if needed.
- The Tournament Director with the approval of the Chief Official reserves the right to delete, combine, or alter any category or division if necessary, for the successful running of this tournament.
- Any division changes affecting minors must have parental written consent of all competitors in NEW/RECEIVING DIVISION.
- Any division changes affecting adult competitors must have the written consent of all competitors in the receiving division.

*belt rank groupings will ultimately be decided by the Tournament Director based on registrations. Half ranks are treated as the lower half (i.e. orange-green is treated as orange).

U10 - Scored randori. There will be no losers Born: 2017-2018 Ranks: NOVICE: Yellow/Orange; INTERMEDIATE: Green and up No chokes or armlocks. Modified Medical Rules. See Below Duration: 2 minute matches with no stoppage time. No Golden Score.

Note - Modified Medical Rules: All U14, U16 and U18 contestants will be allowed two one minute free medical examinations per competitor per match (does not include treatments for bleeding) without penalty. A third examination for the same injury to the same competitor in the same match will result in their opponent being awarded the win by "Kikengachi". All incidents of bleeding in these two age categories will be dealt with in accordance with current IJF Competition Rules, Article 29 (Bleeding Injuries).

Freestyle Judo Competition

In order to cultivate the spirit of Judo through creative means, the Golden North Open™ will launch a new event called Freestyle Judo where pairs or singles of Judoka will be able to put together a routine and perform it in under 5 minutes. The performance can be akin to kata routines and use elements of Judo theory and practice. The event will be judged using 5 key categories: originality, structure, physical difficulty, efficiency, and benefit to Judo. Each category will be evaluated using a score of 1-10 by each judge and averaged to provide a final score. Competitors will all receive a recognition of their contribution to this inaugural event, evaluations will be shared with competitors. Competitors will be divided into different age/belt groups as listed for shiai, deferring to oldest and highest rank in the pair.

How the Freestyle Judo Competition works

- 1) Register as Single or as a Pair (\$35) www.ninjaacademy.ca
- 2) Any age Judoka (pair defers to oldest and highest rank)
- 3) Use of Judo techniques, kata, forms, randori and theory can be used
- 4) Competitors must perform without speaking (kiai is allowed)
- 5) Coaches can silently support performance off the presentation area
- 6) Striking (where contact is made) is not permitted
- 7) Techniques that are banned from regular shiai for safety reasons are not permitted (like: Kani basami, kawazu gake, do-jime, leg locks, throwing with armlocks or chokes) and age/grade specific limitations from the rules matrix
- 8) Presentation area is inside 8x8 metre space

Please note: Freestyle Judo event is inaugural and does not have weight or point value with regards to dan grading. It is a creative exercise for Judoka to enjoy. Please see the Freestyle Judo demonstration policies on the registration page for more info.
