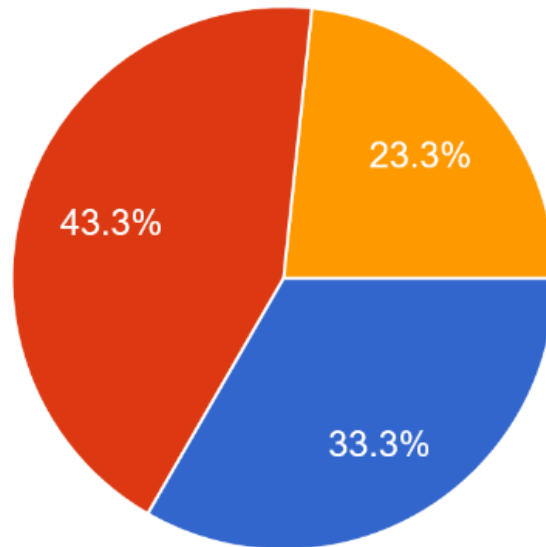

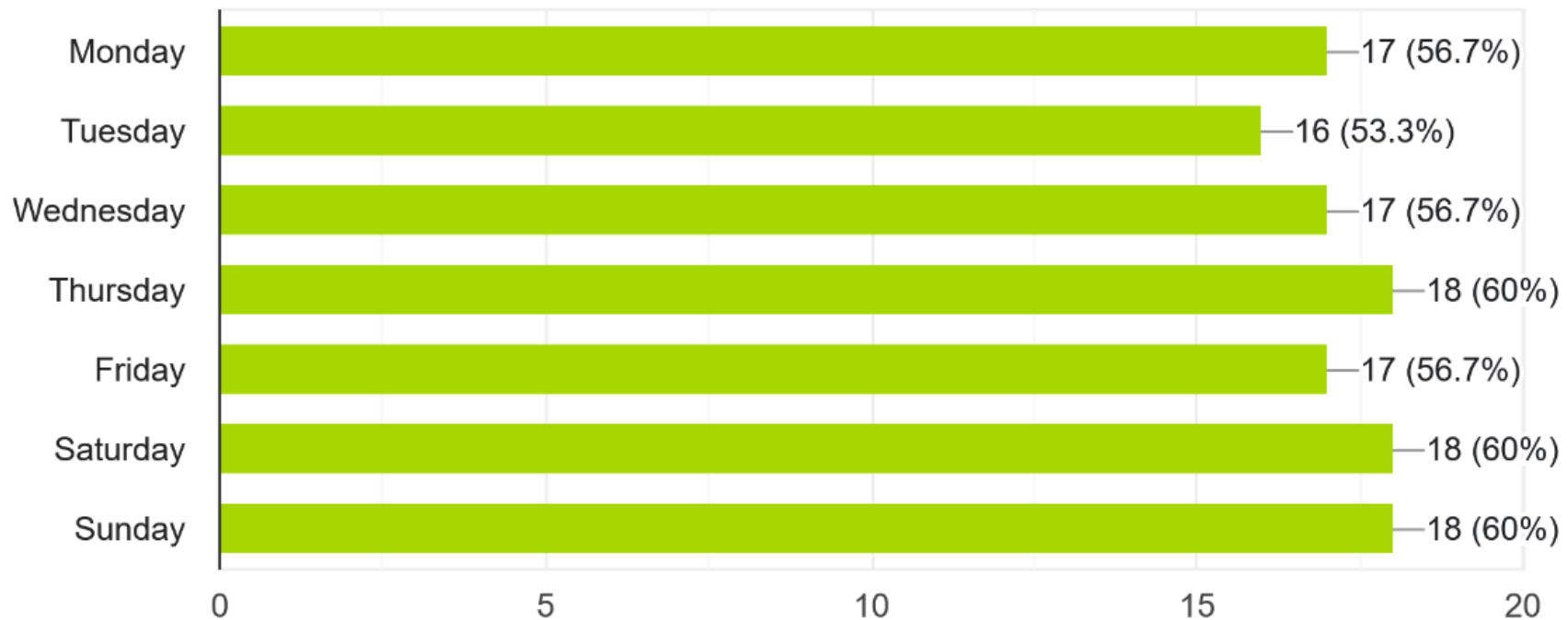
- I love outdoor play! I will play a lot more

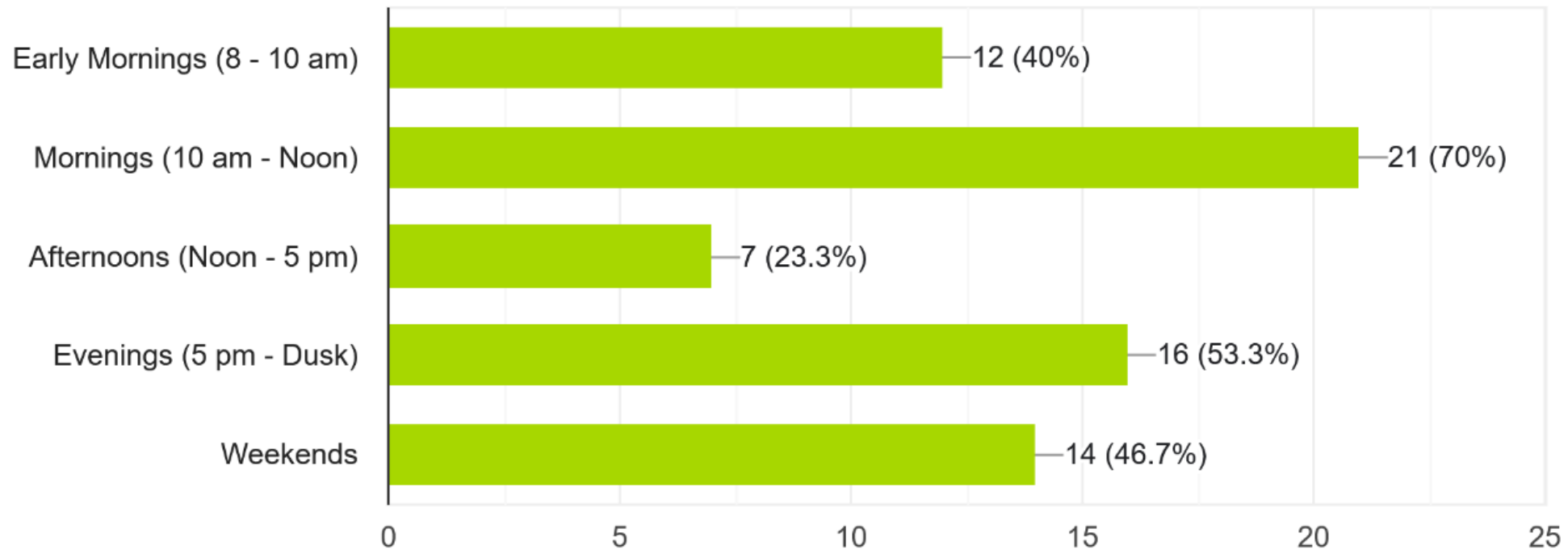


What Time of Day?

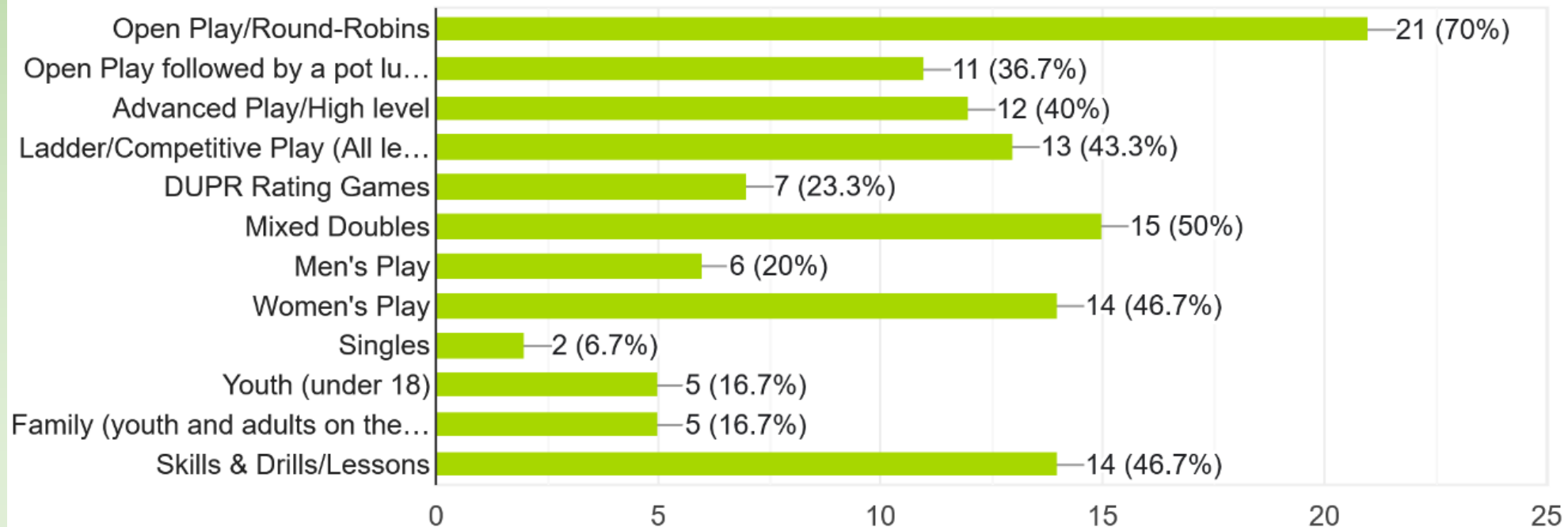
What Programming?

How to be Successful



- I think by promoting the new courts to places like: Flesherton advance All local news papers Larger social media accounts and platforms It would gain more traction for the courts and hopefully expand the club (if that's what you're looking for)
- Our people are used to playing with Osprey or Road 32, so it will take at least a season before they migrate.
- Regular weekly learn-to-play sessions set at different times so that working people can attend as well as retirees will help, announcements in the SEGCHC&MGH websites & The Advance, posters around town...and a grand opening of course.
- Also reassuring folk who live nearby that there will never be lights for late night play.
- By making the courts as accessible, both physically and financially, to everyone.
- Fairly enforce skill levels at leveled play - don't dilute advanced sessions with intermediate and beginner level players.
- We need to ensure novice players have the opportunity to develop, encourage family participation
- Host a community BBQ with Learn2Play sessions & games to watch
- Put out notifications to all other fairly local pball courts (I know I'm not the only one who will travel to play and enjoys playing at various locations)
- Host a tournament in late summer/early fall, perhaps partnered with a group like TPA to get more visibility through their website & players from various locations

How to be Successful (continued)



- Host family night Learn2Play for parents and kids, will the school help promote this?
- Ask folks to sign up to email list for chance to win their first "pickle pass"
- Open play is very good for community But city must implement court rules
- Get outdoors and get involved
- On line booking system for court and program access.
- Dupr games for even player skill matches
- Drop in games for with courts for different level player requirements ie 2.5 to 3.0. 3.0 to 3.5. 3.5 to 4.0. And adv 4.0 plus
- Events Demos with high level players
- I hope we'll also have some weekend slots, expecially of we can invite friends (that are visiting for the weekend) to play too.
- I think more youth PB camp would be great. Thanks for making this happen. What a great asset for our community!
