## 1. Health Orders Extended

In case you haven't heard, the Saskatchewan Health Orders have been extended to January 29. They specifically state that "All team/group sports, activities, games, competitions, recitals, practices, etc. are suspended, including amateur and recreational leagues for all age groups. Examples include hockey, curling, racquet sports, cheerleading, dance practices in group setting, etc."

Anyone in contravention of these guidelines could be fined and should be aware that any insurance provided by Pickleball Canada is not in effect.

## 2. Pickleball Canada- Membership Fee Changes

Pickleball Canada will be adjusting its annual membership dues from \$5.00 to \$10.00 effective on or before April 1, 2021. This will bring the total annual fee for membership in Pickleball Canada/Saskatchewan/Regina to \$20.00

An in-depth review of expenses and initiatives to both manage rapid growth and to continue to prioritize and improve the advancement of pickleball at the national level has resulted in this decision. Rising costs of insurance for members is a major contributor to the need to adjust the fees.

Pickleball Canada is a growing concern; membership is now in excess of 22,000 and climbing! While play is temporarily suspended, the planning and development of programs continues for insurance coverage, officiating, coaching, National System [event management, membership management, content management (website)], ratings, club support for leagues and ladders, youth, recreation, discounts and sponsorships.

## 3. Pickleball Canada National System - Launch!

Pickleball Canada has been developing a fully integrated system for pickleball clubs across Canada. The Pickleball Canada National System (PCNS) will bring together many of the independent systems now being used into one single

integrated system. Modules include membership, rating brackets, scheduling, websites and tournament play/results across the country.

Saskatchewan will be one of the first provinces to implement the membership and website modules starting in late February or March 2021.

As part of the new PCNS, all memberships will be changed to expire on December 31<sup>st</sup> of each year. During 2021 your renewal reminder email will still come at the start of the month of your current expiry date, but your renewal will only extend your membership until December 31<sup>st</sup>.

Going forward, all members will renew during December for January 1<sup>st</sup> of the following year. New members (or late renewals) can be done at any time throughout the year; however the membership will still expire on December 31<sup>st</sup>.

Pickleball Canada is considering providing 13-15 month memberships to any new member joining October 1<sup>st</sup> or later. New members joining on or after October 1<sup>st</sup> will receive a membership until December 31<sup>st</sup> of the following year.

Keeping your membership up to date keeps your Sport Injury insurance in force plus provides opportunity to receive invitations to register for organized play and training opportunities.

## 6. New Pickleball Rule Changes for 2021

New rule changes are being introduced for 2021. Most will affect how the referees manage tournament play. Here are the key changes that impact <u>all</u> players:

- 1. Service lets have been eliminated. If the served ball clips the net and falls in the correct service box, the ball is "live" and play continues.
- 2. There is a new, Provisional, rule regarding Drop Serves. Servers may drop the ball (<u>without</u> propelling it or tossing or hitting it upward) and hit the ball after the ball bounces on the playing surface. The server's release of the ball must be visible to the referee and the receiver. *The restrictions on upward motion and angle of the paddle no longer apply.* This rule was primarily intended to accommodate physically handicapped individuals but is an option for all players.
- 3. The entire score must be called before the ball is served.
- 4. The server's partner may call the score if the server is unable to call the score with sufficient volume. In this case, the person calling the score shall not change during the game.
- 5. If the server or referee calls the wrong score, any player may stop play before the "Third Shot" occurs to ask for a correction.

- 6. Players should not call a ball "out" unless they can clearly see a space between the line and the ball as it hits the ground.
- 7. "Out" line calls should be promptly signalled by voice and/**or** hand signal, whereas formerly voice signals were always required.

All rule changes are effective January 25, 2021.

Watch for the registration (without payment) starting on April 5th with a final decision set for June 1, 2021.
