Format:

- **<u>Round robin</u>** format with players assigned to pools of up to five players depending on registration numbers.
- Round Robin games played with the first team to 11 points declared the winner (note: no win by 2 pts). Scores are recorded with the top four players in each pool going to the semi-finals.
- <u>Semi-finals:</u>

Tier One - Top two players from each pool with most wins go into semi-finals. If tied, best +/-, if tied, most points scored. If still tied, flip a coin. Winners of each semi, go to final.

Tier Two – Third and Fourth place finishers in round robin go to semi-finals.

- Semi-finals and finals are to 15 pts and must win by two points. *Note: If tournament is behind schedule, tournament director may decide to have games go to 11.
- **<u>Referring</u>:** Referee for the round robin will be the player in the pool with the bye for that game. Referees will be primarily responsible for calling foot faults in the kitchen and on the service line, keeping score and assigning a player from the winning team to take the score card to the scorekeeper's table. Players on the court where the ball lands, make the call as usual, and if they can't, they defer to their opponents or referee. However, the referee can overrule if they are sure the call is not consistent with what they saw. If a decision cannot be made definitively, the point is played over at the discretion of the referee. Spectators will not be asked or consulted with any call. Decisions regarding rule interpretation will be at the discretion of the head referee and are final.
- It goes without saying, that good sportsmanship is expected in all players.
- There will be recognition of winners and runner ups at the close of the tournament. Pictures will be taken and published on the DPA website. No prizes.
