The 2023 Pickleball Alberta provincials are occurring August 10-13 in Red Deer hosted by our club. Player registration opened on May 10<sup>th</sup> via Pickleball Brackets and as of today 413 people have registered.

We anticipate we will need approximately 100 volunteers plus referees to manage and operate this premier event. Some positions require certifications/tournament experience (we will train if needed) but most just require enthusiastic/dedicated pickleball fans. At this point all lead coordinator positions are filled.

Many of you indicated an interest on your 2023 RDPC registration/renewal in helping with tournaments in some way. We look forward to you being part of the tournament experience.

We will be posting our volunteer sign up form in the very near future. Volunteer positions include help with the beer tent, food services, volunteer management, silent auction, set up/take down, daily maintenance, tournament desk, possible billets, photography, first etc. Some areas already have heard from volunteers last year willing to help.

Some members still make use of the courts at Bower Mall (especially on those windy or rainy days). We are glad to see the usage of the courts but we need to have members step up as captains for various evening sessions. Recently, the door was left wide open from an afternoon session. This is very concerning. If you use the courts please sign in, make payment and ensure any non member friends have signed a waiver and made payments. The last people using the courts need to turn off the lights and ensure the door is locked. (The code to enter the Bower mall courts is: touch the Yale logo and enter 3131 then checkmark. To lock: close the door and press the YALE logo on the lock. Check the door to ensure it is locked). Bookings are done via Hold My Court (go to our Winter Play page on our website for more information).



As we get closer to 700 members let's work together to share the facility for all to use. Recently a ball machine was left outside over night (always put it away when you are done unless the next booked person is there waiting). Balls are not being put back in their holders (sometimes up to 15 balls are left sitting on the courts). The washroom has been left unlocked over night with the lights left on. We can do better. As with the indoor courts the last people on the courts need to ensure the washrooms are locked as well as the main gate.

One final area needing reminders is that the use of Hold My Courts for private play. It would be considerate to not book multiple private courts for more than 2 hours at a time, back-to-back. or multiple times in a day. This will ensure others can access the courts as well.
