Scheduled Calendar Play

We will be offering the usual play opportunities you need to book through Pickleball Brackets. The June calendar will have all the different playing opportunities and playing times. There will also be an explanation of playing formats at the end of the newsletter.

Junior Pickleball

Our Junior Pickleball Program is doing extremely well and we are now offering a Level 2 program (by invite) to the children who are showing stronger paddle handling skills and are ready to participate in a game format. Coach Alistair and his team will be working with 20 children during this next session.

Team Challenge Event

Our Tier 2 teams are gearing up for their challenge on Friday June 9th, 4.00-8.30pm. 12 players will be placed in four teams and will be competing in Men's, Women's and Mixed Doubles, hoping to be the overall champions and take home the prize money. We would love to have spectators out to help cheer the teams along.

King of the Court

This is a fun format where players play timed games in a round robin format hoping to finish on the top court with a win and ultimately be crowned "King of the Court". There will be two sessions in June.

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Monday Night Leagues for 3.5 and 4.0 Players

Monday Night Leagues will commence Monday Jun 5th, 6.30pm-9.00pm and run for 6 weeks.

All games will be a round robin format and scores will be entered into Pickleball Brackets and go against your club ratings. You do not need to attend every week.

When: Commences Monday Jun 5th, 2023 Time: 6.30-9.30pm Level: 3.5 League & 4.0 League Cost: Normal Fob in.

After players have completed their round robin play they are free to mix with other courts and continue to play until the end of the night.

Limited spots available every night so be sure to OPT IN quickly. You can OPT IN one week in advance (6pm) up tp 1.5hrs before play.

Signing up and Commitments

Members are reminded to sign up for club scheduled play using Pickleball Brackets. The Board of Directors are asking members to be diligent when signing up. Whether we organize play or events we plan and organize session times based on the number of members who have signed up. For many events we book times, and we ask volunteers to assist in putting on these activities. When members who sign up and do not show up it puts a lot of stress on volunteers to make events work when the anticipated number of players do not show up. It affects the planners, the daily hosts, and the volunteers who give up their time to assist that day. It is a fact that things occur which affects a person's ability to attend and we recognize that will happen time to time. It is appreciated when we are notified when that happens after the closing of activities, that certainly helps. However, we would like to minimize that as much as possible and would ask you not to sign up to session if you are certain you cannot make that commitment. We appreciate your cooperation in this matter, and we will continue to make things as smooth and enjoyable for all on those days. Thank so Much!

Pickleball Outreach and Education Update

The club continues to invest in growing the Chilliwack pickleball community with time and energy Workshops teaching pickleball to the Elder College students, Teaching the Teachers of Chilliwack, teaching school classes, and teaching youth through our own youth program. It doesn't happen without the leadership of Lyle Simpson, and Carol Hart plus the many members who volunteer to teach these groups. Currently Lyle and Carol are working on an application to the Provincial Gaming Fund to support our youth work. It is an extensive process requiring data and community references. Every group that we have asked to support this application have given the club high praise. We hope all this hard work will pay off in a successful application. Keep your fingers crossed!



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New Skills and Drill Program

Starting June, we will be implementing a new way to join in some great skill sessions, both for the beginner players and the next level player. The beginner session will run for the first hour of the session. The focus will be basic dinking, serve, return of serve and the third shot drop. Along with scoring to prepare you for the games that will follow the skills session.

The Next Level players 2.25 through 2.75 players will be a 4 week program and run the second hour of the session. This session will do more drills to advance the 4 basic shots mentioned above. To approve those shots, working on consistency, pace, and your technique of completing these skills. See below.

By splitting these times, it will make it easier for us, as the coaching staff, to make sure we have the right coaches for the level of play.

Now for the best part

There will now be a cost implemented to these programs.

- Beginner sessions you will receive a free 6 punch player card. After you have used up that card you may purchase a new card 10 sessions for \$30.00.
- Players will also still be required to fob in.
- The Next Level session will be a 4-week program for \$28.00 plus you will be required to fob in. Commencing Tuesday June 6th, 13th, 20th, 1:30-2:30 pm & am; July 4th, 11.30-12.30 pm. 10 (No session on June 27th).
- Limited to 8 Players

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Formats

Court Assignment – Players will play on their assigned net for the first hour of play with other players closest to them in skill level. For the second hour of play, players may mix and play with other players on one net up or one net down.

Open Play – Players may play on any net marked with their assigned colour. The Host will let you know what colour has been assigned to you for that particular day.

Men's Set Doubles - Players will form a partnership with another player of their choosing and play against other teams in a round robin format.

Women's Set Doubles - Players will form a partnership with another player of their choosing and play against other teams in a round robin format.

Mixed Set Doubles - One man and one woman will form a partnership of their choosing and play against other teams in a round robin format.

Men's Random or Scramble – Players will play with each player in their grouping in a round robin format.

Women's Random or Scramble - Players will play with each player in their grouping in a round robin format.

Coed Random or Scramble - Players will play with each player in their grouping in a round robin format. The group may consist of any combination both men and women.

Mix N Match - All players of varying skill levels will be mixed to play with each other for the first hour of play. For the second hour of play, players will play on nets designated for their skill level.

Skills & Drills - For the first hour your instructor will lead you through various drills designed to improve your pickleball skills. Open play will resume for the second hour.

Silver & Gold - After each game the winners will be placed on one list and the losers on another list. The next four available winning players will then play making sure to switch partners. The next four available losing players will also play making sure to switch partners.

The Mixer - Play on designated nets with other players closest to you in club rankings. Format is a round robin. Groupings will be 8-10 players. Games are timed. No scores are recorded.

2 Up/ 2 Down - Players will play the first hour on a designated net according to their skill level. The second hour the top two rated players will move up and the bottom 2 rated players will move down. If there are 5 players the middle rated player will not move up or down.

Social Play

Players will be encouraged to play on the suggested nets for their skill level. A signup board will be placed at each skill level and players will signup on the board at the completion of every game. The first 4 players listed will move to the next available net.

Women's & Men's Round Robin Rating

Players will play in groups of 4-6 with other players closest to them in skill level. Format will be a round robin. All scores are entered into pickleball Brackets and will go towards your club rating. Players should all be within
