1. Call to Order	Dan Burke called the meeting to order at 10:37 AM and quorum was established with 15 members attending the meeting.	
2. Overview of Club's History	An ad was placed in the newspaper for members to join the league. Play was at Algonquin SS. A group of members established an executive and stayed on for	

some time. Last year 3 opted not to stay on the executive so Dan and Tom stayed and Michelle, Luis and Peter filled in the remaining positions. The AGM is usually held around September 1st (as that's the start of a new pickleball season in North Bay) but without locations for club play, the meeting was postponed. NOTE: Pickleball Canada/Pickleball Ontario start their seasons on January 1st. The Board last met September 5th where a designated beginner's court was approved. During the summer, Sunlife ran a fun tournament at Bourke's and Peter ran a successful ladder. Currently there is no available space for indoor play including Algonquin SS (cleaning staff shortage) and Canadore Commerce Court (due to equipment which covers at least one court). 	At Tweedsmuir, the club paid for 2 courts for a couple of days costing ~\$1,000 for the summer. Originally, the club paid at Tweedsmuir to get on the City's radar. After the first year, the club quit reserving courts which eliminated the rental cost. Members just went and played at whatever times they could, and since tennis was just drop in - why not do the same for pickleball. The club continued to supply balls (stored in the shed) for pick up play. Once the new executive is established, they can continue the investigation for indoor places to play in the winter months. Canadore Commerce Court may be available for club members to play on a certain day/time. The club is aware that Northern SS is allowing Sturgeon Falls players to use their facilities yet nothing in North Bay. Some members are playing at other facilities (KTP, Granite Club, Callander, East Ferris, etc.) and not playing at Bourke's in the summer so what are the benefits being a club member?

A drop-in fee will be charged for players who haven't joined the NBPC and POA. A non member having paid three drop-in fees must join the POA and NBPC to continue to play

Policy 4.3 Rotation of Players – Canadore College Commerce Court Campus

Board communication with the CNB required for indoor facilities for the winter months.

Membership year shall run from January 1 to December 31

Policy 5.3 Pickleball Association of Ontario Membership (PAO)

Moved by Tom cook Seconded by Michelle Cundari that the following be removed "It is the responsibility of a member of the N BC to maintain and communicate PAO membership status to the membership director of the NBPC each membership year".

<u>Facilities for Play – Bourke's Courts + New</u> Equipment

The club is unsure of what the cost to play at Bourke's Courts will be as the public can walk in and play for free. Suggestion to pressure our new City Council to not charge the club. Chris and Michelle have had previous contact with our new mayor, Peter Chirico. He had been out to play at Bourke's near the end of last season.

There is a Grant Officer for the City who can be applying for grants to cover costs to update and

maintain the existing Bourke's Courts (which currently has been handled by club members (especially Kevin who came and cleared the courts of water, leaves, dig poop, etc.). There will be 10 courts painted this year so there should always be room for the club to play. The Port-A-Potty's were not maintained – no TP, dirty, etc. The new directors can discuss the feasibility of having them, paying anything for them and how to ensure they are usable.

The city paid for 4 nets with wheels and 6 other cheaper nets (which surprisingly lasted well) for use at Bourke's. The club paid for the repairs. It is usure if the City of North Bay will purchase new nets once the courts are painted in 2023.

As discussed earlier, we need indoor facilities for the winter months. Canadore is building some indoor courts but what availability (if any) will the public or club have? The Granite Club is also proposing an indoor build with 2 tennis courts and 6 pickleball courts but it wasn't presented at their 2022 AGM because they are still resourcing funding. Widdifield has a gym with 3 good courts which can be used but there is no access to the school.

If the City applies for grants or discusses the needs at Bourke's (posts, nets, lines, surface, shade, etc., it is hopeful they will reach out to the club for input. Again, it's crucial to get better communication with the City of North Bay (CNB).

Membership Capping

With the increase of players and lack of facilities, do we consider capping our club membership? Luis advised the general rule for capping is 100 members per court available. Our club has not capped members and, as previously noted, we currently sit at ~250.

7. General Discussion

Playing Time

Discussion arose around playing time for those working as evenings seem to have fewer players. Players can play the drop-in fee and play whenever they use the KTP facilities as it's currently not club play. Courts are now being reserved for groups wanting to play in the evenings.

Provision of Standard Balls for Play

With balls still in the clubs' inventory, can the club not provide balls to play with so everyone is playing with the same ones. The members can contribute towards the costs for the balls.

Currently the players at KTP provide their own
