#### About:



#### Coaches training and pickleball clinics with Tracy Bennet

This month our club was one of the 3 stops for this year's NCCP Professional Development Tour. It was facilitated by Tracy Bennet, who has years of experience in coaching and development, originally for Tennis Canada, and now for their Pickleball division. About 20 instructors, including a number of CPC members, spent the afternoon unlocking the secrets of how timing, rhythm, and momentum are the keys to the technical fundamentals in pickleball. Tracy also ran a number of player workshops over the weekend, mostly attended by our members, and on Saturday participated in a wonderful day of exciting play with other top-level women players at Topspin in Abbotsford. Those of us lucky enough to attend, were treated to some absolutely amazing pickleball viewing!! The NCCP tour continues on throughout the rest of the country over the next 6 months and will be back in BC again next year!

Rec play will also have a sessions at the Landing on June 12th from 12:30 - 3:00, and on Saturdays, June 7th and 21st from 10:30-1:00 at the Curling Club. Mixers will be held on Wednesdays from 10:30-1:00, as well as Thursday, June 5th and Fridays, June 13th and 27th from 12:30-3:00.

JUNE CANCELLATIONS: The city has cancelled play at the Landing for June 24th, 25th and 26th









