




Welcome to our July/August Newsletter

Chilliwack Fall Tournament October 17th-19th, 2025

Calling all players and volunteers!!!! The end of August is just around the corner and before you know it we will be hosting our **Fall Tournament**. It is now open for registration at www.pickleball.com and the following are some important dates:

REGISTRATION:

Before Sept. 30th, 2025 (6pm) - Early Bird (Members only) \$45 + \$20 /event (Non-members) \$55 + \$20 /event

After Sept. 30th, 2025 (6pm) -Late registration

(Members only) \$55 +20 /event (Non-members) \$65 +\$20 /event

Registration Deadline: Oct. 9th, 9:00 pm





(NOTE: Pickleballtournaments.com also charges \$5 US per event (max 2) for their processing fees)

EVENTS:

On Friday the 17th we will be running _Men's and Women's Doubles, 50 and over (2.5 & under, 3.0, 3.5, 4.0, and 4.5 & over)

On Saturday the 18th we will be running the **Mixed Doubles, Any age and 50 and over** (2.5 & under, 3.0, 3.5, 4.0, 4.5 & over)

On Sunday the 19th we will be running Men's and Women's Doubles, Any age (2.5 & under, 3.0, 3.5, 4.0, and 4.5 & over)

We will be sending out a call for all volunteers at the beginning of September so please keep some (or all!) of the tournament weekend clear on your calendars and lend us a helping hand if at all possible! There will be a sign-up sheet posted on the whiteboards in the Landing lobby where you will be able to jot down your name and join our wonderful crew of tournament volunteers!

Fall Play Sessions

Our reduced summer schedule at the Landing is continuing through August, but in a few weeks, we will once again be returning to a more robust schedule for September. A copy of the new <u>September calendar</u> (also found on our website) will be at the end of this newsletter, so take a minute to refresh yourself with what sessions will be available and, more importantly, please pay close attention to the <u>updated start</u> times!! Here are just a few important things to note:

Club Play sessions: Since we are still able to access evening hours in the month of September (this will end when other regular evening Landing programs resume in October), we have tried to allow as much access to Club Play as possible for our working members. Each week in September there will be an evening session for 3.0 and over, and another for 2.9 and under. These will typically be on Tuesday or Thursday evenings from 7-9:30, but please check you calendars carefully.

Skills and Drills: Skills and Drills sessions will resume again on Tuesdays (12:30-3:00) starting on Sept. 2nd. Sign in/sign out requirements remain the same but please note that sessions cost will now be 2 play credits instead of 1.

Partner Drills (with Coach Alistair): These sessions will resume on Mondays in September, starting on Sept. 8th. Levels 2.26-2.75 1:00-2:30

Levels 2.76-3.25 2:30-4:00

Winning Team from each bracket receives \$100.

Teams must have a combined DUPR Rating of between 16.00-18.00.

There cannot be more than a 1-point rating differential between the highest and lowest rated player on the team. (Based on DUPR ratings)

Only the Captain needs to register their team. In the event a sub is needed it will be the captain's responsibility to find a sub who fits the guidelines stated below.

Cost \$100 per team.

I love to quilt and spend many hours at my sewing machine. Also, volunteering has been a big part of my life.








