This fall we had the opportunity to rent Gym 161 on Monday nights at Banting Memorial High School. With only two courts available, we decided to try a level-specific night for 3.25+ players.

We registered 12 players and ran a Round Robin format. Mary Parsons came up with a great idea for random seeding—drawing a facedown playing card (Ace to Queen) to assign numbers 1–12. It worked perfectly. We played 12-minute timed games and then rotated.

We also mixed things up with a ladder-play night and some dinking-games. Everyone seemed to have a b-a-double-l, with plenty of laughs throughout the session. A big thank-you to all of the spares who stepped in when needed.



The New Tec Pickleball Club ran another Learn to Play program at Banting on Wednesday nights over four weeks, from November 26 to December 17. We had five club members participate, along with seven new members who joined to experience pickleball for the first time.

We began with basic drills and serving fundamentals, rotating partners so everyone had the opportunity to meet and build social connections. As the program progressed, we moved into game play while explaining rules and scoring—often the most challenging part of the game for new players. The group came together quickly, and it was very satisfying to see their skills and understanding improve each week.

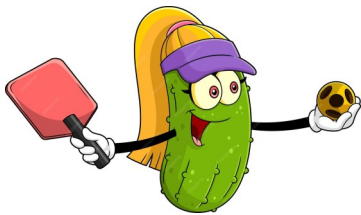


Rules? Really? We Follow Them?

How often have you been on the court and there has been an argument over what is legal or not legal. But it's only rec play, they say. So what rules are you going to apply?" Asking for a friend...

Key Rule Changes for 2026!

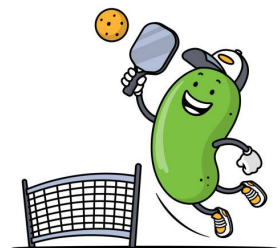
- **Volley Serve Clarification:** Added "clear" and "clearly" to the three volley serve requirements (*upward arc, paddle head below wrist, ball below waist*) to give referees grounds to call faults when a serve looks questionable. **So servers - no more sidearm angle shots! Up, up and away...**



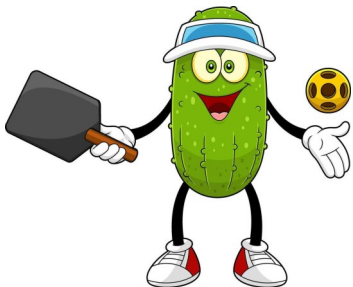
- **Prompt Out-Calls:** Players must call a ball "out" promptly, even if it's a dead ball, to prevent delays. **Did you say out? Start yelling!**

- **Net-Plane Violations:** Clearer distinction between crossing the net plane *after* a legal shot (sometimes allowed) and *before* striking the ball (always a fault). **No more reaching over the net to tag the ball!**

- **Rally Scoring Update:** The game-winning point can now be scored by either the serving or receiving team, removing a potential freeze at game point. **Rally on!**



- **Spectator interference:** Changed from "should not" to "must not" for players consulting spectators on line calls, with penalties possible. **Mums the word!**



- **Double Hit" Clarified:** If it's one continuous, directional motion, multiple hits (triple/quadruple) are legal; a carry (catching/throwing) remains illegal. **A quadruple hit? That's some fast action!**

- **Dead Ball" Play:** If a ball bounces legally on your side and then hits the net post, it's a dead ball, and you win the point. **It's a post mortem on the play!**

We will be bringing in a coach or two for the Intermediate level based on numbers. Stay tuned for more.

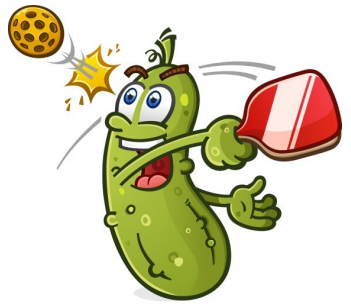
♦ Fun Day:

Communication is Key!

Communication in pickleball isn't just about calling balls — it's about anticipation, teamwork, and trust. The best partners read each other's positioning, stay vocal, and move together.

Next time you step on the court, take a minute to talk through your plan, agree on cues, and keep that "rope" between you tight!
