

Canada vs. West Germany, Montreal Forum, March 14, 1975.

Results as being announced. Inconsistent announcing and severe humming on p.a. interfered frequently. Placings are believed accurate, with Mills/Quibell recording. Crowd announced as 14.9 thousand. Mills left at 11:00 p.m. with men's high jump just starting and pole vault still continuing. The 10 lap relay was starting to organize, women's section, 30 min. late. There was no intermission. Tickets were \$7 top, programs were \$2.00. 3 laps equalled 400 m. synthetic over board, banked.

Shortly after 2400 m. McLaren came on strong, but fell to 3rd-2nd at 2800 (7:29) with Weight, a short, cool guy then coming very strong, Sensburg tucked in with him, and McLaren struggled but had nothing. Announcing here was rapid in French only and much more attention by the announcer (just one person) on the Claude Ferragne.
