TEAM REPORT

Most members of the team reported on Thursday evening and the balance Friday morning. A Team meeting was scheduled for 10:00 A.M. with a 98% attendance. At this time all administrative instructions were given to the members regarding protocol, transportation, opening ceremonies, uniforms and all relevant details regarding events and schedules. Both Coaches, Bob Meldrum and Dave Lyon, then instructed them on the technical details of the meet, and with the little time available to them, did a first-class job. Emphasis was placed on the moral aspect of the team, that although the Russian team was highly rated, pride and desire would pull us through. Team spirit was essential and that all must help each other.

I should point out at this time, the technical meeting was scheduled and held on Thursday morning without any of the official staff in attendance. This was unfortunate, but I understand this meeting had been scheduled and agreed on, between the Montreal organization and the Russian officials in advance, and although the Montreal organization made every attempt to delay the meeting until the evening, the Russian officials would not concede. We were very fortunate in having Ken Porter in attendance at this time, and he took over the duties of the Canadian Technical official. In my estimation and that of our coaches he did a first-class job and fought them on various contentious points gaining the advantage for our team. I personally thank Ken for taking on this difficult job and congratulate him on looking after the team's interests in such a fine manner.

I had a few problems in fitting the team with uniforms and strips, however not knowing the composition of the team until four days prior to the meet, I had to "crystal ball" sizes, and do apologize to the team members who ended up a little "off size" and thank them for their spirit and indulgence under the circumstances.

The selection of the fifteen athletes (ten men five women) for the opening ceremonies was left to the athletes themselves, they were in turn briefed by the Montreal organization on their duties for the opening ceremonies. I personally was very impressed by the way they conducted themselves. Bruce Pirnie was given the honour of carrying our flag and Glenda Reiser given the honour of exchanging

the flowers and the Canadian pennant.

The meet itself and the results are now history, however, on behalf of my assistant Jenny Meldrum and our coaches we have to admit to tremendous pride at the way our team performed. Quite frankly the point results are only numbers as far as I am concerned, the effort, pride and desire shown by all members of the team is what gave the greatest satisfaction, if this team spirit can be maintained and must be maintained, then our future looks very bright indeed.

I feel it only fair to mention and congratulate some of the more outstanding performances.

Tony Tenisci and Bob Venitti for their excellent performance in the 35 lb. weight throw. A new event for our team.

Debbie Van Kiekebelt for her excellent and winning performance in the Quadrathlon.

Rick Cuttel for his fine performance in the Pentathlon, I should mention that Rick had a foul jump (1 inch only) in the long jump of 25' 9".

Wendy Taylor for her 50 yd. hurdles Canadian Record.

Bruce Simpson for his courageous performance in the Pole Vault, Bruce unfortunately had an accident with his pole earlier in the event and had to revert to a lighter pole, but for the loss of this pole he was obviously in an 18' plus mood.

Bob Raftas who I'm sure had one of his greatest performances ever.

Sue Turpin and Louise Hanna who utterly demolished their opponents in the High Jump.

Serge Jeudy, who responded to the Montreal fans and courageously fought from nowhere in the early going in the 400 metres to almost winning the event.

Bishop Dolgiewicz who had a long and tiring trip from Texas but gave a fine performance in the Shot.

Abby Hoffman for her calculated win in the 800 metres.

Grant McLaren for his magnificent win in the 3000 metres and who was responsible for the fans almost bringing the roof down.

Claude Ferrange for a fantastic performance and win in the High Jump.

Our victories in both relays, with Brenda Walsh overcoming, what appeared to be an impossible gap, when starting off on her four lap leg, yet courageously fighting every yard and coming in victorious.

It was indeed a pleasure to see Grant McLaren being selected and awarded the trophy for the outstanding Canadian athlete, and Claude Ferrange for the outstanding athlete of the meet.

I have mentioned the highlight performances, but let me assure you, every member of the team was a success, they accepted the challenge of a superior team and never at any time quit giving their all. Yes, we lost the meet, but if we maintain this team spirit, success will be ours by 1976 !

My sincere thanks to the team and staff, it was a pleasure being with them.

ADMINISTRATION REPORT

I find it indeed difficult at this time to put into words the frustrations I suffered during the two weeks prior to the meet. As the National Team Manager I was unfortunately in a position of having to listen to the many people and factions involved in putting on this meet. I was not in a position of authority to make decisions of selection, finance, protocol and the many other facets concerning the meet. However, as Manager I had to obey the wishes and directions of the Canadian Track and Field Association - the body to whom I must answer to.

In looking back over those two weeks, each individual, and faction, was indeed trying to do what they felt was best, within their powers of jurisdiction. Many of our problems arose because of the time element. The meet was negotiated rather hurriedly, and of course being a meet of this stature a phenomenal amount of work had to be accomplished in a very short period of time. It would appear, there were two critical items that caused much of the contention which eventually almost caused a confrontation; that of selection and finance.

The Selection Committee had indeed a problem, they in all sincerity wished to select the strongest team possible, but unfortunately had to select within a dollar figure. C.T.F.A. had a problem in not having a budget to work with. The meet, we must recognize was not in our program and, therefore, was not budgeted. The Montreal organization had a problem in not being able, in the beginning, to offer any monies for transporting the team to Montreal. In such a situation it is no wonder that tempers were raised and many accusations were thrown around. However, as the one in the middle of all this, I felt that certain terms of reference laid down were not being adhered to, and in other areas, there were no terms of reference laid out what-so-ever. In hind sight one can now see how many of these problems could have been solved, and as we are all normal and human did eventually solve them, but unfortunately had to suffer in the process.

I do not want to belabour our faults, but we must work in a cohesive manner, we are all, without a shadow of a doubt, dedicated to making Canada a power in world track and field athletics, and I know everybody involved in our organization is dedicated to producing the finest and best team ever for competition in the 1976 Olympics.

ADMINISTRATION REPORT - cont'd

On one of my trips through Montreal, I passed by a statue of a famous Scottish humanitarian, whose words came back to me, and just may be the solution to some of our problems, and I quote

O WAD SOME POWER THE GIFTIE GIE US,
TO SEE OORSEL'S AS OTHERS SEE US !

We must recognize each others problems, and the unfortunate inadequacies that crop up in our system, such as finances, our vast geographical problems, and the difficulties of selection. However, strange as it may seem the results of all the confusions prior to the meet, was success beyond our wildest hopes.

It is my earnest desire and wish that everyone involved in the many contentious problems, will carry on with complete dedication, and not hold animosities towards each other. 1976 is not too far away and we must learn to work with each other in a united and friendly manner.

There was little written communication because of the time element. Fourteen definite positions were selected on March 14th. At this time I was informed by C.T.F.A. that the team transportation cost must not exceed \$5,000. This information was relayed to the selection committee, also informing them that the fourteen athletes had a transportation cost of approximately \$3,100. These athletes were contacted and confirmed their availability. The committee then completed their selection in Quebec after the National Championships on March 18th and relayed their selection to me by telephone. The transportation cost of the complete team had now reached \$6600. I immediately contacted H.Kerrison for direction, and later had a conversation with our president, who advised me to stand by for further instructions.

I believe during the period of March 14th to March 18th negotiations between C.T.F.A. and the Montreal Organization were being carried out in an effort to come to a financial agreement on transportation costs. However, at midnight of March 18th I was informed to move only one athlete per event into Montreal for the meet, and await further instructions.

On hearing of this, I decided that the situation was now intolerable, that we were committed to an international meet of vast proportions, taking into consideration, the Montreal commitment, the public, the politics, and the ramifications if we only put forth a token team. At 7:00 A.M. on Monday, March 19th, again taking into consideration the time required to assemble a team in Montreal, I contacted our Executive Director and informed him I was moving the team as selected by the selection committee, regardless. I freely admit to stepping out of line, but was prepared to go looking for the balance of monies myself. Shortly after this conversation I was given official permission to move the team as selected.

All athletes were then contacted through branch personnel for their availability, and the necessary tickets and flights arranged. I would at this time thank all those branch personnel who helped me, and made the job of assembling the team in Montreal a success.

Adidas was contacted, and the necessary order and supplies of uniforms arranged for delivery in Montreal. Their co-operation was excellent.

Our team was quartered in the Quality Inn, a first-class hotel, the Russian Team in the Bonaventure. We were on a meal per diem of \$14 per day, the quality of the food was excellent.

The Montreal Organization were extremely helpful and met with me on my arrival, and did everything possible to see that all our wishes were fulfilled.

WE had a brief training session in the Forum for an hour and a half on Friday afternoon. The Quadrathlon and Pentathlon got two events in between 4:00 P.M. and 6:00 P.M., also the 35 lb. weight throw competition was held at this time in another facility.

After the meet all athletes and officials met in the Bonaventure for a get together, where refreshments and snacks were served. I took this opportunity of presenting the Russian staff with the C.T.F.A. official memento of their visit, a book entitled "Canada, A Year Of The Land." In replying to this

presentation the Russian Manager was very appreciative of the hospitality shown his team, he also congratulated our team for their performance, saying he was indeed impressed, and felt that another such meet, should be arranged. His parting words were, that if this was the nucleus of our team for 1976, then he felt Canada would indeed prove worthy opponents.

I would take this opportunity of thanking the Montreal Organization for their hospitality and co-operation which made our stay exceedingly pleasant, and made it possible for our team to perform so well.

My sincere thanks to our Executive Director, Harry Kerrison, our Treasurer, Bill Crothers, and our President Harvey Pearce, who had a difficult time with the many problems and pressures they had to endure throughout the meet negotiations. To Ken Porter as Selection Committee Chairman, and for his help during our stay in Montreal. To Larry Eldridge for his assistance both before the meet and during our stay in Montreal. To our staff of Jenny Meldrum, our physiotherapist Karin Austin and Coaches Bob Meldrum and Dave Lyon, who all did an outstanding job !

M O N T R E A L O R G A N I Z A T I O N

The Canada-Russia meet committee have to be congratulated on successfully negotiating this event. We must recognize the courage and determination they displayed in overcoming many difficulties in a short period of time. It appears they don't recognize problems, but work hard at solutions !!

In early conversation with Larry Eldridge, he promised that the good and welfare of our athletes was his first concern, this promise was carried out in its entirety !

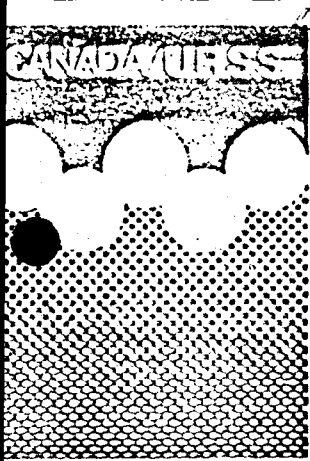
